

As anyone following the design and architecture scene knows, tiny houses are a trend that's been skyrocketing in recent years, driven both by economic need and a cultural shift toward downsizing. But with the market so saturated, it's hard for new tinies to truly stand out.

Standing out, however, is no problem at all for the latest entry onto the tiny house scene, from the team at Haus.Me. The new sibling to their existing series of sleek, pre-furnished, sustainably powered tinies (including a modular, 800sf two-bedroom model to which more rooms can be added) is more than just small and pretty: It's downright advanced.

Made of 3D-printed components in environmentally friendly steel, fiberglass, wood, and glass, the fully furnished and self-contained house is delivered in one piece, requires no foundation (or even a building permit, in most places), and it's fully "smart." A remote controls the password-protected door, providing touchless access and making the Microhaus a perfect rental unit. And self-adapting lights, touchless faucets in the full bathroom and kitchenette, and air-quality sensors (connected to



a HEPA filter) are part of the basic package.

Even better, it's genuinely green. Generously daylighted by a massive, curved picture window on each of its long sides, it runs entirely on its own solar power—which works even after extended runs of cloudy days. It even recycles and purifies its own shower water!

Furnishings include a double bed, plenty of storage and shelving, and all the little necessities like bedding, towels, kitchen appliances, and even wine glasses. And at only 140sf and about 9000 lbs, it's light enough to be towed by a car, so this little house can travel wherever you roam. Just plunk it down and it's ready for surprisingly affordable living, starting at only \$60k.
