With 4K content featuring HDR (high dynamic range) available from streaming services like Netflix and Vudu as well as 4K UHD Blu-ray players and gaming devices such as the PS5, you'll need a 4K UHD TV to take advantage of that resolution and lifelike color that HDR provides. Whether you are a gamer, cinephile, 3D enthusiast or TV junkie, there is a 4K UHD TV to fit your

budget and lifestyle.

Best Bang for Your Buck: LG C1 OLED Series



LG makes some of the most impressive OLEDs (organic light-emitting diode) TVs on the market, and the 4K LG C1 OLED Series is no exception. The C1 has four HDMI 2.1 ports for all of your UHD devices, a new processor for better upscaling and surround sound, and a Game Optimizer setting so gamers can quickly adjust settings on the fly.

Best for Built-in Sound: Sony A90J OLED Series



Some 4K TVs skimp on built-in sound quality and speakers, maybe because the manufacturers figure that you're going to hook your TV up to a surround system anyway and bypass the built-in speakers. If you plan on using your TV's built-in speakers as your primary speakers, however, the A90J uses the entire surface of the screen as a speaker and backs it up with two bass drivers for rich sound.

Best Budget TV: TCL 6-Series QLED with Mini LED



If spending more than \$1,000 for a 4K TV doesn't fit your budget, check out the TCL 6-Series QLED with Mini LED. The TV uses Mini LED backlighting and quantum dot technology that is usually only available on TVs that cost hundreds of dollars more than this one. It can't produce the perfect blacks of an OLED or the brightness of higher-end TVs, but it's still great for streaming 4K content from Netflix or Hulu.

Best Midrange TV: Sony X90J 4K TV

If you don't want to splurge on an OLED but can afford something a little better than a budget model, check out the Sony X90J 4K TV. It comes with the Google TV platform installed, which makes setting the TV up and streaming through various services a breeze. It also come with Dolby Vision HDR and Dolby Atmos audio built-in.

Best Non-OLED for Gaming: Samsung QN90A QLED

The best TV for gamers is still the LG C1 OLED Series mentioned at the top of this article, but the Samsung QN90A QLED is the best choice that is not an OLED. Not only can you play 4K games at 120 fps from either the Xbox Series X or PS5, the TV has VRR support and incredible response time for all of your gaming needs.

Best Blacks on Non-OLED TV: Samsung QN85A Series Neo QLED

OLEDs are praised for being able to display perfect blacks with no backlighting, but those inky blacks come at a premium price. The Samsung QN85A Series Neo QLED boasts blacks that approach those on OLEDs for a couple hundred dollars less. The Samsung's built-in sound is nothing special and there is no support for Dolby Vision HDR, but if you have your own surround sound system and can live without Dolby Vision, the QN85A is one to consider.

Best Rollable TV: LG Signature OLED R 65" Class Rollable 4K Smart TV

You read that right: this tricked-out OLED TV rolls up for viewing and down when not in use. This OLED TV has the perfect blacks and Dolby Vision support you would expect from LG, plus that futuristic rollable feature that will cost as much as a house in some towns.

Best Ultrathin TV: LG WX 65 Wallpaper 4K OLED



We're not really about hanging TVs on walls, but some people can't resist filling up that pesky space above the fireplace with a giant TV. (Helpful tip: You generally want your TV to be at eye level, not up by the ceiling.) If you're that person who likes the over-the-fireplace vibe, you know that thinner is better. How about 0.15 inches thin? That's what you'll get with this "Wallpaper" LG 4K OLED, a 2020 design-award winner.

Best 4K TV with Biggest Screen: Samsung 85" Class 4K Crystal UHD

If you're convinced bigger is better, how does 85 inches sound to you? The Samsung 85" Class 4K Crystal UHD doesn't have the picture quality and deep blacks of OLED TVs, but it makes up for its shortcomings in screen size. If you have a large theater room and don't want to go the projector route, this 85-inch beauty might be just the right size.

Best for 3D: LG E6 OLED Series

After the success of *Avatar*, 3D movies were commonplace in theaters and at home. Today, the 3D craze has waned and only Warner Bros. still produces Blu-ray 3D discs regularly, with Vudu as the only major streaming service that offers 3D content. Back in 2016, LG became the first (and last) company to make 4K OLED TVs that were also 3D capable. The future-proof LG OLED65E6P was one of the models, described by some as the "best TV ever."

The TV has since been discontinued and LG no longer makes 3D TVs, but out-of-box and refurbished units still surface on Best Buy, Amazon and eBay, ranging in price from \$1,500 to over \$10,000, depending on condition. If you still enjoy 3D but want that feature in a 4K OLED TV with HDR, this is it!
